

# **PLAY BASED LEARNING**







In 2020, Sacred Heart implemented the Walker Learning Approach (WLA) in our junior classroom. Walker Learning is a research based approach to learning, designed to provide a balance of explicit teaching of literacy, numeracy, Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) and other curriculum areas, with time for children to actively investigate a range of skills and experiences for life, through planned play, or projects.

'Investigation time' takes place 4 mornings per week. The aim of the WLA classroom is to promote a sense of wonder, exploration, investigation and interest by providing a rich range of materials, resources and opportunities in which children can engage. Play and active investigation gives children opportunities to develop physical competence, to explore and make sense of their world, to interact with others, to express and regulate their emotions, and develop problem solving abilities. Research shows strong links between play and foundational capacities such as memory, oral language capabilities, self-regulation, social skills and success at school in general.

The investigation stations change every 2-3 weeks and are based on the children's interests and what is being taught in other curriculum areas. The investigation areas include Dramatic play, Science & Environment, Mathematics, Construction, Tinker Table, Reading, Writing, Art & Collage and Sensory. These stations give the children a chance to extend or support the learning from all curriculum areas based on their individual needs.





# **PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES**

## **Programs and Initiatives include:**

- A Restorative Practices approach to behaviour management and student wellbeing focusing on forgiveness and teaching desired behaviours
- Building respectful relationships
- Small classes to promote student engagement
- A commitment to improving literacy and numeracy outcomes for all students
- Sacred Heart is an OLSEL school (Oral Language: Supporting Early Literacy)
- Student Leadership Teams Where all students have a voice and work collaboratively with staff, the school families and wider community to solve problems and better our schools.
- Staff trained in making adjustments for students with diverse learning needs.
- LSOs trained forum phonological awareness and reading intervention programs.
- A student outreach program: Mini Vinnies—Students learn about raising awareness about Social Justice issues and Fundraising for; Caritas, Catholic Mission, Cancer Foundation and St Vincent de Paul Society
- 'Community Freezer,' which provides meals for families in need.
- School involvement in local community events e.g. Kelpie Parade, ANZAC Day, Casterton Show

### Response to Intervention (RTI)

At Sacred Heart, we know that while some students have a straight road to achieving their learning goals, others have a longer path to travel. We have a multi-tier approach to classroom learning, which enables teachers to identify the abilities of individual learners and provide additional instruction to learners who may benefit from support in smaller, more targeted settings.

Student achievement is closely monitored to help both teachers and students understand how their development is progressing, and to celebrate success in their learning. Teachers use this data to make decisions about a student's instructional needs and whether they may need a higher level of intervention.

Three Tiers of Intervention

- Level 1 Good classroom teaching using high impact stitching strategies.
- **Level 2** Boost teaching for low or high achieving students, which involves an extra teacher or Learning Support Officer coming to class to take small pull out groups.
- **Level 3** Students who are well below the expected standard, are given the opportunity to attend evidence-based programs. At our school we offer MiniLlt, Gillon Phonological Awareness Program, MultiLit Reading Tutor Program and ERIK.

# **WESTERN TRINITY CATHOLIC SCHOOL NETWORK**

### Western Trinity Catholic School's Network

Sacred Heart School combined with St Malachy's, Edenhope, and St Joseph's, Coleraine, are now known as: The Western Trinity School Network', these three small Catholic primary schools banded together to tackle the problem of teachers working in isolation. The Western Trinity School Network has grown from termly planning meetings for teachers, to the schools becoming one PLC. From the outset, the 'Western Trinity' principals were keen to refine the joint planning sessions. All three schools embraced the PLC methodologies and practices to drive collaboration. We created a Guiding Coalition that meets fortnightly via Video Conferencing and Professional Learning Teams of teachers who meet weekly.



# Our Mantra is 'United, we all succeed.

## **Professional Learning Community (PLC):**

Professional learning communities (PLCs) are an approach to school improvement where groups of teachers work collaboratively at the school level to improve student outcomes. PLC schools start from a simple idea: students learn more when their teachers work together. Building a PLC is a proven way for schools to increase student learning by creating a culture that is:

- focussed on continuous improvement by linking the learning needs of students with the professional learning and practice of teachers
- committed to professionalism
- fuelled by collaborative expertise.

# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **Educating in Faith**

Sacred Heart School assists parents to develop their child's faith. Children participate in Religious Education lessons using the curriculum document called Awakenings, which has been provided by the Catholic Education Office Ballarat. Religious Education focuses on Life to Faith to Life. This means starting with the children's experiences, teaching about faith and relating the faith traditions into life.

### **Special Needs**

Children with special needs are supported and fully integrated into the life of the school. Children with specific learning, physical, emotional and/or social needs. If a student has a disability, the school makes adjustments to a child's education program so they can participate like all other children. Adjustments may be in the form of additional programs, extra one to one time with a Learning Support Officer or extra equipment, such as, a dedicated iPad for use in class.

### **Camps and Excursions**

Sacred Heart School has a sequential camps program. This program begins in Foundation and Year one, with day excursions. Year two and three children have an overnight camp in the local region, travelling up to 2 hours away. The Year four, five and six students attend camps with the theme of bush, sea or city for up to three nights in an area ranging from 1 hour away to Ballarat or Melbourne.

#### **School Counsellor**

Our school has a school counsellor. This service provides wellbeing support for students and families in need. It also provides wellbeing tips to support staff in their teaching roles.





# **PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT**

#### "Parents are the first educators of their children."


At Sacred Heart School we believe that parents are our most important partners in children's development. Parents are warmly invited to be involved in their child's education and in the life of the school.

Parent satisfaction with the school is rated as being a major strength at the school, ranked in the top 8% for all Victorian Catholic primary schools

Sending your precious children to school is always a big step and we like to think that you see the school as partners in the ongoing development of your child/ren. Therefore, parents and carers are always welcome at any time, we want you and your child/ren to feel at home.

#### **Enrolment**

Children who will be five years of age, on or before April 30th of the year they commence Foundation (Preparatory), may be enrolled at school. Birth Certificates, up to date Immunisation records from MyGov and Baptism Certificates (if applicable) are to be presented when submitting enrolment forms to the school. A comprehensive transition program between kindergarten and school is offered to all children at the end of each school year so the students beginning their school journey are well prepared.
